MRC DEPLOYMENT PLAN TEMPLATE



- This is a generalized deployment plan template and "plug-and-play" procedures for local MRC leaders to deploy their volunteers.
- Designed to be easy to use by local MRC coordinators.
- Designed to encourage and equip local MRCs to deploy volunteers as needed for emergencies
- Designed to be easily incorporated into plans that local MRCs may already have in place, or be adapted for those that do not have anything





MRC DEPLOYMENT PLAN TEMPLATE

NEEDS ASSESSMENT (VOLUNTEER AND COORDINATOR)

- Two needs assessments were conducted.
 - Volunteer
 - Coordinator
- Will assist with:
 - Training Workshops
 - Webinars
 - Plans and Policies
 - Future three-year Improvement Plan



GAP ANALYSIS (VOLUNTEER AND COORDINATOR)

- Reports from both assessments will be completed.
 - Can be used for future MRCIL planning
 - Can also be used for future state planning
 - Can be used for future funding opportunities
- Once published, they will both be made available to all MRC leaders throughout the state.



- This training plan takes results from both needs assessments
- Would show the direction in which the MRCs in Illinois would look to train to stay current
- Would assist MRCs with interoperability across jurisdictional borders
- Would assist MRCs on what training was needed for deployment outside of their jurisdiction in case of an emergency




MRC 101-TRAINING

- To be held the 3rd Thursday of the month at 10am



BACKGROUND CHECKS/VOLUNTEER PROTECTIONS



- Funds are available to all MRC units, designed for:
 - New volunteers
 - Strike team volunteers
 - Those being sent on deployment
- Both available for:
 - Background Checks: \$120
 - Volunteer Protections: \$650

Purchase

MRC unit purchases background checks/volunteer protections

Submit

MRC unit submits reimbursement form with necessary receipts

Review/Reimburse

MRCIL to review and reimburse up to \$120 per MRC unit for BC and \$650 for VP

PROJECT-SPECIFIC SUB-AWARD EXPENSES: ALLOWABLE



- MRC Logoed Uniforms
- Office Supplies
- Educational Materials
- COVID Vaccine
- Food*

- Food* explained by Project Officers
- Food meals: Generally, food is not allowable unless
- light refreshments are included under the venue rental, then this may be allowable.*
- Outside caterers are also allowed if the food for training events is in accordance with the food guidance.
- If the training is a full working day (8 hours); only one light meal/light refreshment may be purchased per 8-hour working day. Please ensure this guidance is followed when purchasing food.
- Do note that the one meal a day for a full-day workshop/training/conference, it must be related to the awarded project activity and with a primary purpose of dissemination of technical information beyond the recipient and is necessary and reasonable for successful performance.





PROJECT-SPECIFIC SUB-AWARD EXPENSES: RESTRICTED



- Recipients may not use funds for research or clinical care.
- Recipients may not use funds to purchase furniture.
- Recipients may not use funds to purchase sterile needles or syringes for the hypodermic injection of any illegal drug.
- Recipients may not use over forty (40%) percent of the funding for administrative costs.
- Recipients may not use funds to advocate or promote gun control.
- Recipients may not use funds for lobbying activities.
- Recipients may not use funds for fundraising.
- Recipients may not use funds for the purchase of vehicles or vehicle parts.
- Recipients may not use funds for construction, alteration, or renovation is not permitted.
- Recipients may not use funds for promotional items or giveaways.

NEW MRC SUB-AWARDS

- This is a completely different award, and available to two potential new units per year.
- It provides sub-awards to local agencies in areas of need and without an existing MRC.
 - To help establish or re-establish a registered MRC.
- This sub-award can be used to provide support, training, administrative help, management planning, and needed supplies to launch an MRC





EMERGENCY GO-KITS

- As a part of Goal 3, to assist in Bolstering MRC unit's capacity to respond and serve their communities, this grant will seek to provide Emergency Go-Bag Kits to each MRC
 - They are not required to be accepted, but they would be shipped directly to your unit
- Along with this would be the purchase and shipment of identifier vests.
 - Again, not required to be accepted, but would be shipped directly to your unit






MEDIA COMPANY RECRUITMENT CAMPAIGN DEVELOPMENT






MRC-STTRONG Projects

The Administration for Strategic Planning and Response had a grant opportunity for the MRC- State, Territory and Tribal Nations, Representative Organizations for Next Generation (MRC-STTRONG) Awards. There was only one award allowed per state, territory, tribal nation, freely associated state, and the District of Columbia. MRCIL applied with the support of the Illinois Department of Public Health and the assistance of Integrated Solutions Consulting.

MRCIL was awarded \$2 million dollars through this opportunity and is the only non-state awardee of this grant.

The overall goals for the MRCILs awarded grant are as follows:

- Goal 1: Bolster MRC planning in Illinois
- Goal 2: Strengthen MRC's capacity and knowledge base
- Goal 3: Bolster Illinois' capacity to respond
- Goal 4: Build brand recognition
